Additional Information

In 2008-09, almost 2/3 of our student population received services from the child welfare system. This was expected to be the case, based on the design of our model. Since well before we opened in summer 2008, we were convinced that our unique population warranted a multi-faceted approach. This was far more comprehensive than simply becoming a high performing reading and math charter school. Our approach required us to emphasize the cultivation of a strong and supportive culture as much as we emphasized strong classroom instruction. We were understandably excited to have reached our internal objectives for 2008-09.

- 1. Successfully established a safe and supportive school culture.** We have dedicated as much time to the development of our School Culture and Social Curriculum as we have to our educational program. Children who are victims of trauma, abuse and neglect need to feel a sense of security in order to be able to develop academic and pro-social skills. We have worked tirelessly on unifying the language our adults use and maintaining calm responses with children in order to help our kids learn to trust us and our school. We have several students with severe emotional needs. These students are victims of trauma and can be violent and physical when they are having an emotional episode. However, these same kids are capable of meeting grade level standards. If they were in other types of schools, these children would likely be suspended, expelled or referred for Special Education settings. Our goal is simple: Remove the barriers to academic success faced by children in the child welfare system. Our response is clear: Support the child through crisis, work to prevent additional crisis from occurring and improve the emotional stability and academic abilities of our students. This school year we record 16 instances where a student's address was changed as a direct result of their family's involvement in the child welfare system. We have a team dedicated to preparing for family disruption and responding to the needs of our students in the child welfare system who are frequently pulled from homes which commonly results in a change of school and negatively impacts their academic progress. We are pleased to report that even though our students have experienced 16 incidents of emergency address changes (removed from the home or change in foster family), we were able to keep all of those students enrolled at Haven Academy with minimal school being missed.
- 2. Trigger Academic Results from our collective efforts.** Establishing strong culture and after school programs are never ends to themselves; they are designed to support our conviction that even a challenged population like ours can learn at or above grade level if given the proper supports. Our academic success is akin to a marathon, not a sprint. In fact, it has always been our overall belief that the road to bringing the vast majority of students to grade level by grade three would take every bit of the first two years of operation. Just one year in, we are charting the specific course we expected. Evidenced from the tables above our first grade students increased their group NCE scores by 7 NCE points in reading, and 10 in math. We are enthusiastic about our first year's progress, but as a team we always temper that enthusiasm with the realization of the enormity of the task in front of us. All we can continue to do is provide the multi-faceted supports we know our students and families need to thrive.

Action Plan for Improvement in Value-Added Assessments

Our Team is committed to the ongoing support our students will need to continue to reach and surpass grade level skill mastery targets. We will continue to adjust our instructional program to deliver remedial services to our struggling learners. Support structures include:

- Academic Interventions that take place before, during and after school hours.
- Establishment of our Student Support Team (SST) which functions to create learning plans for struggling learners in an effort to intervene and reduce the likelihood of an unnecessary Special Education Referral.
- Establishment of Collaborative Team Teaching (CTT) classrooms on every grade level in order to serve our student population more effectively.
- Development of extensive Student Support Services which bridges the communication and connection to resources for families involved in the Child Welfare System.
